Ltd. vide letter No. Nil dated 19th November, 2025 regarding the bidding process for consultancy services for the Carbon Trading / Afforestation, Reforestation & Regeneration (ARR) Project in Gilgit-Baltistan.


The meeting was held on 4th December, 2025 under the chairmanship of the Additional Secretary, Forest, Wildlife & Environment Department, Gilgit-Baltistan. The representatives of EMC Pakistan (Pvt.) Ltd. participated in the meeting online.


Proceedings:


- The Chairperson welcomed all participants and briefed the committee on the background and purpose of the meeting.
- The grievance submitted by the EMC was presented and reviewed point by point.
- The EMC representatives were allowed to explain each query in detail during the online meeting.
- The Committee members thoroughly examined the submitted documents, supporting evidence and responses provided by the EMC.
- After a comprehensive discussion and thorough study of the EMC proposal, the Committee formulated the following decisions/recommendations.
